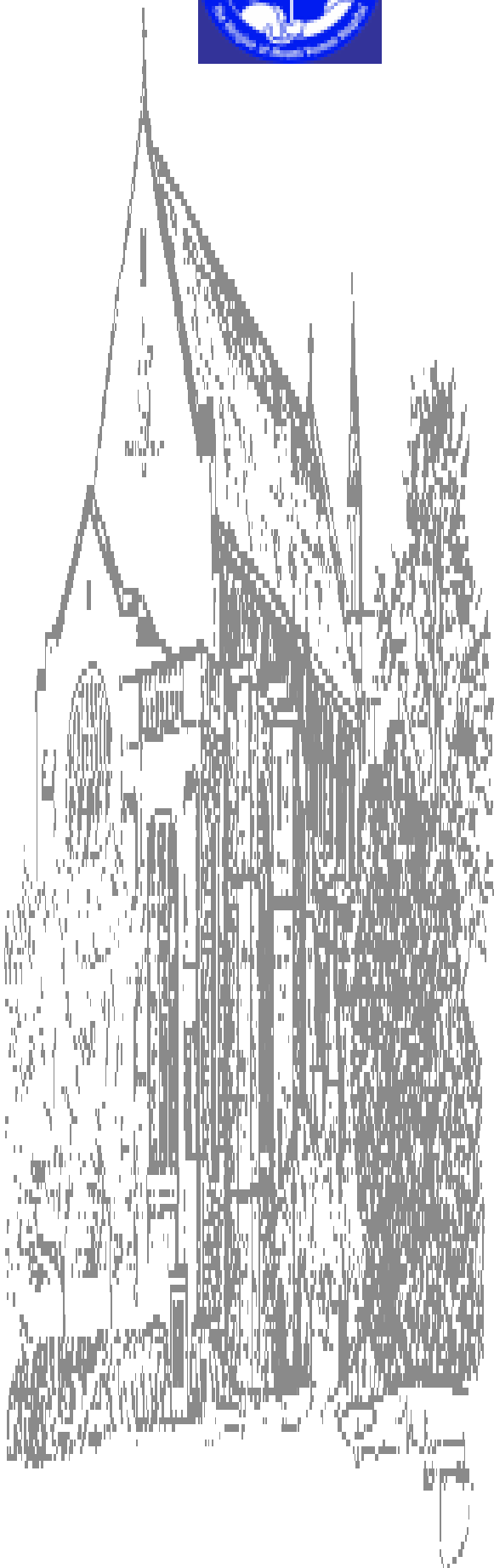

Harrow Symphony Orchestra's next concert on 5th December at 7.30pm in St John's, Greenhill, Harrow will feature the last overture that Mozart wrote, that to "The Magic Flute", and Schubert's last symphony, the 9th known as "The Great", together with the popular Piano Concerto by Schumann.

All of the ticket money will go to the Friends of Michael Sobell House: please turn up with as many of your friends as possible – tickets of £10 each (£5 concessions) will be on sale at the door.

We are so lucky that the Schumann will be played by a soloist who lives locally in Pinner. Russian pianist Albina Stulpinaitė was born in 1987 and gained her early musical education at the Ochtinsky Centre for Humanitarian and Aesthetic Education (1994-2003), and at the St Petersburg Musical Lyceum (2002-2003) under Irina Lobikova. After graduating from the Lyceum she enrolled in the Junior Department of the Royal College of Music, under Thalia Myers, and graduated in 2005 with honours. She is presently studying at the Royal Academy of Music under Colin Stone.

Albina has taken part in many competitions and performed at many St Petersburg venues, including the Small and Large Halls of the Philharmonia. She won 1st and 3rd prizes at the International Ensemble Competition in Daugavpils, Latvia, and is a winner of the Open Festival in St Petersburg. Since coming to London she has won the coveted Peter Morrison Concerto Competition, leading to a performance with an orchestra at the Royal College of Music. Her London début was at the Blüthner Piano Centre.



At the beginning of 2009 Suzanne Thorn (oboe) and Albina got to the finals of the Wigmore Award (Friends of the Royal Academy of music), receiving an opportunity to perform at Wigmore Hall. They have recorded Henri Dutilleux Sonata for oboe and piano for the Academy's CD of French virtuoso music.
